Depending upon qualifications and experience, the position will be either probationary (tenure track) at the rank of Assistant or Associate Professor, or tenured at the rank of Associate or Full Professor. Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.

They will also have the opportunity to access Western's fMRI and EEG imaging equipment, and to apply for internal funding through the BrainSCAN Accelerator Internal granting program. Cognitive Neuroscience is a key area of research strength at Western University with more than 30 Principal Investigators and nearly 200 trainees in the Brain and Mind Institute.
